

Building a United Interfaith Lexington through Direct-Action

Are you looking for ways to do justice, love kindness, and walk humbly with God? You can participate in the multi-congregational justice ministry, BUILD. If you want to be an official *BUILD Network Member* at MPC, please contact Scott and he will tell you more about what that means. If you want to experience the work BUILD does, then you are encouraged to put these dates on your calendar and join thousands of faithful Central Kentuckians working tirelessly to end racial and economic inequality.

Monday, March 27th (7:00 p.m.): The BUILD Rally at Consolidated Baptist Church (1625 Russell Cave Road) is a chance to get excited about the work BUILD is doing in Lexington, and to hear the stories of the people for whom we are doing justice. We will carpool from MPC at 6:30 p.m.

Tuesday, April 25th (7:00 p.m.): The Annual Nehemiah Action Assembly downtown in Heritage Hall is a great opportunity to let the powers that be in Lexington that we are serious about justice. The goal is to have at least 2,000 people at this event, and MPC is determined to represent 1% of that crowd by having at least 20 people attend. Sign up and invite others who you think are interested in standing together for justice in our city. Some of us will walk from Scott's house (1542 Meadowthorpe Avenue) at 5:45 p.m. to save a block of seats. Others will carpool from MPC at 6:30 p.m.

Monday, June 12th (7:00 p.m.): The Justice Ministry Celebration (Location TBA) is a time to celebrate the work that BUILD has been doing and to make a personal financial commitment to the ongoing work that BUILD will continue to do in Lexington.

JOIN SCOTT ON A TRIP TO WASHINGTON DC FOR ADVOCACY TRAINING WEEKEND "Confronting Chaos, Forging Community – Racism, Militarism, and Materialism"

April 21-24, 2017

Join us April 21st for Compassion, Peace, and Justice Training Day at New York Avenue Presbyterian Church (NYAPC) in Washington DC. Gather with your fellow Presbyterians as we look at how our church and our partners are confronting racism, materialism, and militarism in our country and abroad. In plenaries and workshops we will analyze our current context and offer concrete tools for members and their congregations to address these urgent issues. We will learn how we can "forge community" amidst the current chaos in our country. After Compassion, Peace, and Justice Training Day join the ecumenical community for Ecumenical Advocacy Days (April 21-24). Almost one thousand Christian advocates join us every year for a weekend of workshops, lectures, and concrete actions addressing the ills of our nation. The weekend culminates in a lobby day on Monday, April 24th when we raise our voices in the halls of power for a more just society. The one-day training event at NYAPC costs \$75. The entire weekend of events costs \$285. Bob Layton, who lives in DC, has offered free lodging at his place with easy access to the Metro. The only other costs are travel and food. Entombed: A Lenten Worship Journey

Who are you? Who are you in relation to others? How does your faith inform your lifestyle? How does your faith inform your perception of others and your active response to the well-being of others? During Lent...as we walk with Jesus into Jerusalem, gather with him and his disciples for an intimate dinner, stand with him during his trial, watch as officials of the Roman Empire execute him, and then see his body placed and sealed in a tomb...we will reflect on how we often entomb ourselves. As part of that reflection, you may notice, between now and the week before Easter, that the sanctuary will feel more and more like a tomb as the windows are slowly covered with the "stones" that we place around us, keeping us from living the life God created us to live.

Sunday, March 5: We will reflect on what it means to be *Entombed by Temptation* as we read the story of Jesus in the wilderness in *Luke 4:1-11*.

Sunday, March 12: We will reflect on what it means to be *Entombed by Misunderstanding* as we read the story of Jesus and Nicodemus in *John 3:1-17*.

Sunday, March 19: We will reflect on what it means to be *Entombed by Distrust* as we read the story of the Israelites feeling led to their death in the wilderness in *Exodus 17:1-7*.

Sunday, March 26: We will reflect on what it means to be *Entombed by Arrogance (and Destructive Theology)* as we read the story of a blind man who received sight and the Pharisees who were not willing to see in *John 9:1-41*.
