Sadly, the film did not receive an Academy Award nomination for Best Documentary Feature this year. I saw the film twice while it was being screened at the

Kentucky Theatre. It is a documentary that was desperately needed in a time such as this. It is a reminder of what it means to be truly human, to truly live as a child of God, and to truly see others as God's beloved.

When I was in Kindergarten, the elementary school I attended in Oak Grove, Missouri had two blocks of Kindergarten classes (perhaps this was normal for all schools?). One group of kids had their class in the morning and the rest of us had class in the afternoon. I attended the afternoon Kindergarten class. So every day, before I went to school, I would eat my lunch (usually a Peanut Butter and Jelly sandwich) and watch Mr. Roger's Neighborhood.

I loved Mr. Roger's Neighborhood. Of course, as a kid, I didn't really know why I loved it so much. I didn't know that one day I would become a Presbyterian Minister like Fred Rogers. I didn't even begin to understand just how deep and important his lessons would be. I certainly didn't imagine that, in my forties, I would go back and start watching the show from the very beginning after seeing the documentary two times because I wanted to experience his wisdom, insights, and heart for humanity with a much more rounded understanding of Scripture and life itself.

In the film, Mr. Roger's says something as he is reflecting on that question that he asks every week in his song as enters his home as the show begins, **Won't you be my neighbor?** He says,

"I suppose it's an invitation. It's an invitation for somebody to be close to you. The greatest thing that we can do is to help somebody know that they're loved and capable of loving."

How are you doing that as an individual? What could you do better? How are we doing that as a congregation? What could we do better? If we are living our lives faithfully, those questions will burn inside us, longing for an answer, every day.


We are currently collecting non-perishable food items for God's Pantry.


